<b>Vehicle</b>	Switch off engine and electrical equipment. Keep people away and warn traffic. Check for spills/leaks. Call emergency services.
<b>Spill</b>	Keep combustibles away from spilled material. May ignite combustibles such as oil, paper or clothing. Use clean non-sparking tools to transfer material to a clean dry plastic container.
<b>Fire</b>	Use FLOODING quantities of water. DO NOT use dry chemicals CO <sub>2</sub> or foam. Dam water for later disposal. Will cause fire to accelerate. Releases toxic fumes when involved in a fire.

**First aid actions**

<b>If Swallowed:</b>	Rinse Mouth. Call a POISON CENTRE or Doctor if you feel unwell. Do not induce vomiting.
<b>If in Eye:</b>	Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. If eye irritation persists, get medical attention.
<b>If on Skin:</b>	Wash with plenty of soap and water. If skin irritation occurs: Get medical advice.
<b>If Inhaled:</b>	Remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing.
